Fireworks / Summer Fire Safety

Every year in the United States, we celebrate the Fourth of July with community parades, picnics, barbecues, and fireworks, the things of which happy memories are made. But sadly, every Independence Day also includes some tragic events. On average, 32,000 fires occur and 9,300 injuries result from fireworks according to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) and the Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC). 59% of fires caused by fireworks occur around the Independence Day holiday on July 4th. The safest way to enjoy them is through public displays conducted by professional pyrotechnicians hired by communities.

Fireworks Safety

All fireworks are illegal in Marin County. Fire and Police Departments across Marin are warning people that this year the penalties have increased for sale and use of fireworks. Senate bill 839 raises fines for the use of illegal fireworks and even allows the state to suspend the commercial driver's license of someone involved in the transportation of the illegal activity. Fire and police will be patrolling neighborhoods in the interest of community safety and injury prevention.

"Every year we respond to people who sustain injuries from fireworks," said San Rafael Fire Chief Chris Gray. "We are also concerned about the extremely dry conditions and the possibility that just one spark from a firework could create a major wildland blaze."

Barbecue Safety

- Before using a grill, check the connection between the fuel tank and the fuel line. Make sure the tubes are not blocked.
- Be careful using lighter fluid. Never add fluid to an already lit fire.
- Keep all matches and lighters away from children. Supervise children around outdoor grills.
- Dispose of hot coals properly:
 - Douse them with plenty of water
 - Stir them to insure fire is out.
 - Never place coals in plastic, paper or wooden containers.
